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IFM is a higher-level establishment for teaching, executive education and expertise for the textile, fashion, luxury and design industries. Founded in Paris in 1986 by professionals in the sector with support from the Ministry of Industry, IFM is a member of the Conférence des Grandes Écoles and of the International Foundation of Fashion Technology Institutes (IFFTI). IFM's Design Postgraduate Programme represents one of the most reputable fashion courses in Europe. The programme offers three options as majors: Clothes, Accessories and Image.



ISTITUTO MARANGONI PARIS



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Istituto Marangoni arrived in the French Capital in 2006 with the opening in Avenue Poincaré, and has now moved to Rue de Miromesnil in the central 8th arrondissement to offer its students larger spaces and a new design concept. As well as BA, MA and short courses, the campus proposes intensive programmes in Fashion Business & Brand Management, and Fashion Image, Styling & Communication. One of Istituto Marangoni's Paris students, Sasha Nassar, won the International Womenswear Prize at the International Fashion Show of London's Graduate Fashion Week 2013.

The four-year programme at Ecole de Créa & de Management de la Mode in Paris connects creativity and professionalism considering fashion as an artistic vocation at the service of crafts, industry and commerce. Designers must know the techniques of dressmaking to be able to communicate with a pattern maker whose skills are a fundamental part of the fashion process. The study areas also include wardrobe analysis, social and shape garment research.



ISRAEL SHENKAR COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING AND DESIGN

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The school was founded in 1970 with the goal of serving Israeli industry in all that relates to academic qualifications and R&D services for modern industries. Shenkar is an institute of higher education and is supervised and financed by the Israeli Council for Higher Education. Shenkar's uniqueness as an academic institution lies in the close ties between the two faculties: the Faculty of Engineering and the Faculty of Design. While both faculties maintain their own special character, they run joint projects designed to expose the students to various disciplines.



JAPAN COCONOGACCO



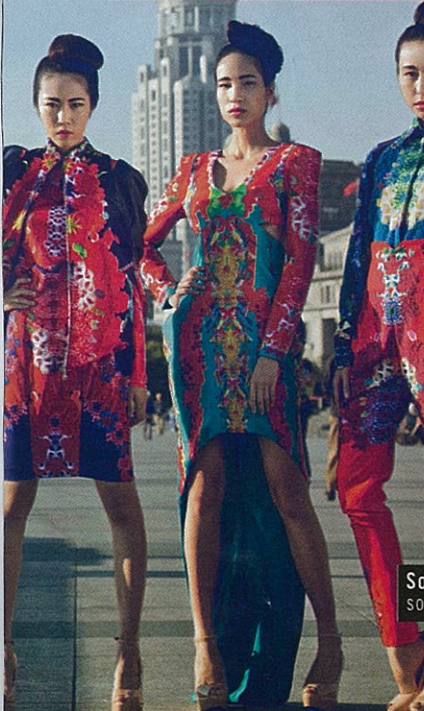

Coconogacco is a private fashion design school founded by Yoshikazu Yamagata in 2008 in Tokyo. "Coconogacco" literally means "school of here", or "school of individuality". The school is organised by fashion designers Mikio Sakabe and Kentaro Tamai, who also teach, collaborate and work with students. Former students have won several prizes, including Takashi Nishiyama who won the Collection of the Year Award (ITS#9); at the 2013 edition of the same contest, Tomohiro won the Fashion Special Prize and the Modatsea Award.

In this quirky, creative city, Otago Polytechnic's School of Design champions hands-on, industry-focused education, producing designers with an individual voice and a global perspective.

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SOUTH AFRICA ELIZABETH GALLOWAY ACADEMY OF FASHION DESIGN



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The school aims to equip individuals with the skills and practical experience required to engage in the entire creative process of fashion, from concept to consumer. The institution's founder Elizabeth Galloway established the academy in 1996, recognising that the fashion industry needed educated and well-trained individuals in order to maintain its high standards. There are also opportunities for part-time programmes and participation in focalised workshops.

SPAIN IED BARCELONA



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Since 1966, the Istituto Europeo di Design has been operating in academic training for the disciplines of design, fashion, visual arts, communication and management in its campuses in Milan, Rome, Turin, Venice, Madrid, Barcelona, São Paulo and Rio de Janeiro. Located in Gràcia district, IED Barcelona Campus covers 5,000 square metres, and since 2002 it has established itself as one of the most important schools in design training, recognised as a School of Higher Studies in Design, which every year draw nearly 1,000 students from more than 80 countries.
